## Introduction

Accurately mapping services is only one factor in underground asset management, another very important factor being the ability to characterise and assess that infrastructure in terms of its condition and failure potential. Extension of the techniques used to analyse the signals employed in the location of buried services might also allow the condition of the services to be determined.

This event will review the key research projects and technologies for assessing the condition of utility underground infrastructure and its failure potential. This will include an update on the Mapping the Underworld project, which is researching the technologies and science required to deal with a number of key issues in managing underground assets such as asset location, its condition assessment, detection and location of leakage and data integration.

Further presentations will provide delegates with an opportunity to learn about the current research projects, technology development and experience of practitioners in applying innovative new technologies to deal with condition assessment of underground assets.
